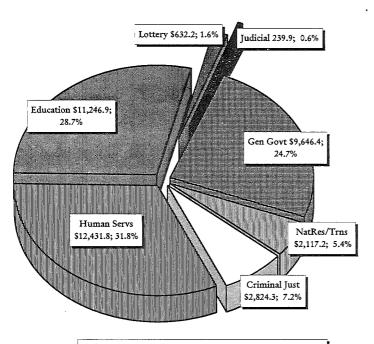
# Appropriations & Fund Sources For Fiscal Year 1998-99 \$45.3 Billion



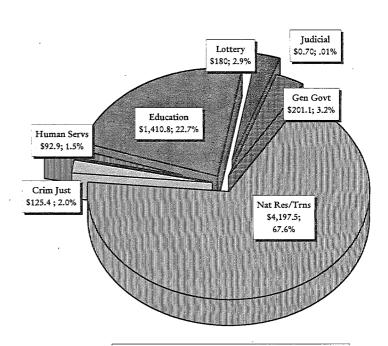




# Operations & Capital Outlay Distribution For Fiscal Year 1998-99 By Program Area - \$45.3 Billion

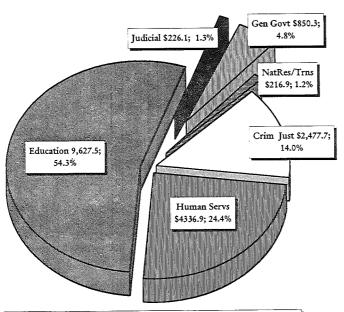

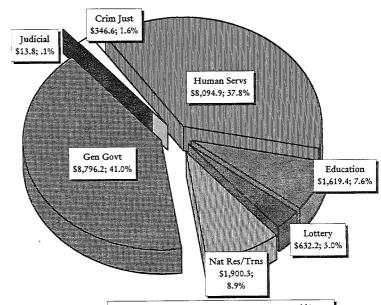


Capital Outlay - \$6,208.3 Million

# Operations For Fiscal Year 1998-99 By Program Area - \$39.1 Billion

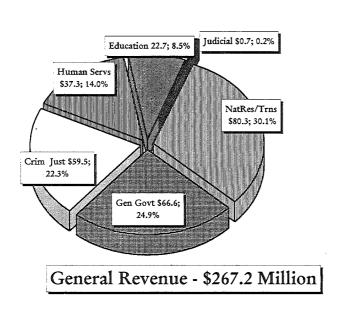


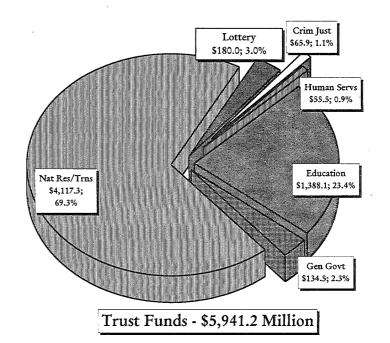
General Revenue - \$17,735.4 Million

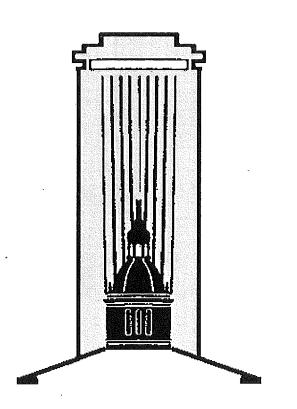


Trust Funds - \$21,403.4 Million

# Capital Outlay & Debt Service For Fiscal Year 1998-99 By Program Area - \$6.2 Billion







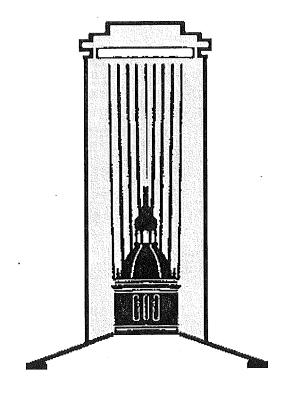

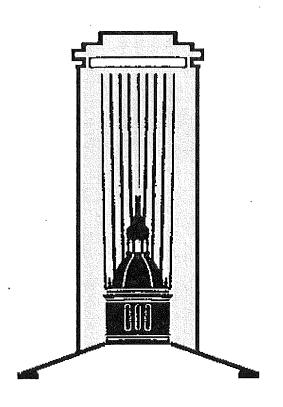
