Education Estimating Conference on Student Financial Aid EXECUTIVE SUMMARY July 22, 2015

The Student Financial Aid (SFA) Estimating Conference met on July 22, 2015, to review FY 2014-15 actual awards and to adopt updated student financial aid program estimates for two programs: the Children of Deceased or Disabled Veterans Scholarship Program and the Florida National Merit Scholar Incentive Program. The FY 2014-15 actual awards data are not yet available for the other programs, including the Bright Futures Scholarship Program, the Florida Resident Access Grant Program, the Access to Better Learning and Education Grant Program, and the Florida Student Access Grant Program. Because no new information was available, the Conference readopted the March 5, 2015, forecast for those programs.

For the Children of Deceased or Disabled Veterans Scholarship Program, the consensus estimate for FY 2015-16 is 1,056 awards, an increase of 155 awards over the March estimate. The increase is largely related to a change in methodology by the Conference. Previously, Conference estimates included only students who submitted a timely application pursuant to Department of Education administrative rules. Beginning with the FY 2015-16 estimate, the Conference chose to base the estimate on the entire pool of eligible students and not just those who submit an application by the department's deadline. In addition to updating the FY 2015-16 estimate, the Conference also adopted estimates for FYs 2016-17, 2017-18, and 2018-19.

For the Florida National Merit Scholar Incentive Program, the consensus estimate for FY 2015-16 is 483 awards, an increase of one award over the March estimate. In addition to updating the FY 2015-16 estimate, the Conference also adopted estimates for FYs 2016-17, 2017-18, and 2018-19.

The adopted student counts for each program are shown on the *Consensus Summary* and in the table below. More details for each program can be found in the *Consensus Detail*. As shown in the table below, across all programs the Conference anticipates 289,232 awards in FY 2015-16 and 104,559 awards in FY 2016-17.
