Education Estimating Conference on Student Financial Aid EXECUTIVE SUMMARY August 2, 2017

The Student Financial Aid Estimating Conference met on August 2, 2017, to review FY 2016-17 projected actual awards and to adopt new estimates for FY 2017-18 through FY 2022-23.

<u>Bright Futures Scholarships</u>: The projected actual awards for FY 2016-17 were **96,823**, an increase of 177 awards (0.2%) over the previous estimate. For FY 2017-18, the Conference adopted **95,817** total awards, including 33,041 initial awards and 62,776 renewal awards. This is an increase of 1,152 awards (1.2%) over the previous estimate, due in large part to an expected increase in the number of high school graduates. For FY 2018-19, the Conference adopted **96,459** total awards, including 34,217 initial awards and 62,242 renewal awards. The initial awards estimate includes additional students who are expected to enroll in a Florida institution as a result of the higher Florida Academic Scholars awards. Because of changes to eligibility and renewal criteria that have occurred in recent years, there remains a great degree of uncertainty in the forecast. As a result, the Conference adopted the higher of the two estimates that were presented for each year of the forecast.

Florida Resident Access Grants (FRAG): The projected awards for FY 2016-17 totaled **37,205**, which was 320 awards (0.9%) below the previous estimate. For each year of the forecast, the Conference used three-year average annual growth rates for each institution. The Conference adopted **37,387** awards for FY 2017-18, a decrease of 628 awards (1.7%) from the previous estimate. For FY 2018-19, the Conference adopted **37,580** awards, a decrease of 964 awards (2.5%) from the previous forecast.

Access to Better Learning and Education Grants (ABLE): There were 2,812 total projected awards for FY 2016-17, which was an increase of 121 awards (4.5%) over the previous estimate. However, this still represented a decrease of 431 awards from the prior year. The Conference maintained the previous estimates for each year of the forecast, which include an estimated 2,733 awards for FY 2017-18 and 2,632 awards for FY 2018-19.

<u>Florida Student Assistance Grants (FSAG)</u>: For FY 2016-17, there were **122,329** projected awards, a decrease of 11,006 awards (8.3%) from the previous forecast. The average award amount, however, was \$94 higher than expected. For each year of the forecast, the Conference assumed that all otherwise eligible students would be funded, which resulted in estimated awards of **234,824** for FY 2017-18 and **236,724** for FY 2018-19.

<u>Children/Spouses of Deceased/Disabled Veterans (CSDDV)</u>: For FY 2016-17, there were **1,210** projected actual awards, a decrease of 38 awards (3.0%) from the previous estimate. For each year of the forecast, the Conference assumed continued, though slower, growth in the number of initial eligible applicants, and renewal rates of 71.2%. For FY 2017-18, the Conference adopted **1,316** awards, a decrease of 141 awards (9.7%) from the previous forecast. For FY 2018-19, the Conference adopted **1,445** projected awards, a decrease of 250 awards (14.7%) from the previous estimate.

<u>Benacquisto Scholarship Program</u>: For FY 2016-17, the projected actual awards of **665** matched the previous estimate. For each year of the forecast, the Conference maintained the previous estimates for the number of awards, including **873** projected awards for FY 2017-18 and **895** projected awards for FY 2018-19.

The adopted estimates are shown in the tables on the following page. Across all programs, the Conference anticipates **372,950** awards in FY 2017-18 and **375,735** awards in FY 2018-19.
