

Source for Revenues and Expenditures...

- Required reporting of revenues and expenditures to the Department of Financial Services (DFS) by local governments provides a comprehensive snapshot of local finances.
- This standardized data allows local governments to be compared across a variety of annual metrics and over time.
 - Annual Financial Reports (AFRs)
 - Uniform Accounting System prescribed by DFS
- Data were downloaded on August 28, 2025. All counties and 407 of Florida's 411 municipalities reported. Duval County government is treated as a municipality rather than a county for reporting purposes (Jacksonville).






Tax Breakout—Statewide Overview of Counties...

Individual County Reliance on Ad Valorem...








MUNICIPAL REVENUES (2020)


Tax Breakout—Statewide Overview of Municipalities...





Expenditure Groups—Statewide Overview of Counties...




Expenditure Breakout—Statewide Overview of Counties...


Expenditure Breakout—Individual Counties...






