

Florida Economic Estimating Conference


July 20, 2021

The Florida Economic Estimating Conference met on July 20, 2021, to adopt a new forecast for the state's economy. The Conference made slight upward revisions, most notably in the short-term, to all key metrics, continuing to ameliorate the dramatically downward revisions to both the near-term and long-term outlooks made in July 2020 immediately after the onset of the pandemic. The new forecast maintains and sometimes exceeds the long-term growth path from the March 2021 conference.

Economic activity has notably increased from the depths of the "Safer-at-Home" period over a year ago. Since then, consumers have cautiously resumed spending in the hard-hit service sector while continuing their purchasing sprees of goods, with some consumers spending down the atypically large savings that built up during the pandemic due to government stimulus, including the \$0.9 trillion stimulus package passed in December 2020 and the \$1.9 trillion package passed in March 2021. While all Florida industries have been impacted in the near term by the pandemic-induced economic contraction, Florida's leisure and hospitality industry has borne the brunt of the longer-term consequences. In tandem with the release of the new forecast, the Conference highlighted the significant downside risks arising from the widening spread of the Delta variant of COVID-19.

Economic activity rebounded in the second half of the State's 2020-21 fiscal year, as the long-anticipated widespread distribution of several effective coronavirus vaccines occurred simultaneously with the last two rounds of government impact payments to individuals and businesses. Whether increasing from abnormally low activity or dropping back from artificially high activity, most Florida growth rates return to their pre-COVID-19 paths prior to the end of forecast period. Across the various elements of the ten-year forecast, some measures of the Florida economy have recovered their pre-COVID peaks, while some never reach them at all.

One measure for assessing the economic health of states is the year-to-year change in real State Gross Domestic Product (that is, all goods and services produced or exchanged within a state). On June 25, 2021, the US Department of Commerce, Bureau of Economic Analysis released GDP data by State for the first quarter of 2021 (January, February, and March).



Florida's GDP movements have nearly matched the nation as a whole, but unlike the data for the entire country, the Accommodation and Food Services industry has been the state's most significant drag. While Florida's GDP tracked 1.7 percent below the estimates made prior to the pandemic in both Fiscal Year 2019-20 and Fiscal Year 2020-21, the Economic Estimating Conference anticipates that the state will move above the pre-pandemic estimates beginning this year. For the 2022-23, 2023-24 and 2024-25 fiscal years, annual growth will average a more characteristic 2.5 percent.

Normally, personal income growth is another important gauge of the state's economic health; however, its changes have been in stark contrast to GDP as federal dollars have flooded into many Florida households. For example, in the first quarter of 2021, Florida's personal income growth shot up 61.9 largely due to the two most recent federal stimulus and relief programs converging in the quarter. Once the federal support measures expire, the state's personal income will recede at an annualized 24.7 percent in the second quarter of the 2021 calendar year to produce a final growth rate for the 2020-21 fiscal year of 8.5 percent. The Economic Estimating Conference expects personal income to increase by 1.5 percent in the current year based on the hope that, as furloughed and laid off workers return to their jobs or find new opportunities, wage growth will offset much of the loss of the massive government relief measures. Thereafter, the annual growth rates are expected to remain solidly above 4.0 percent.




The key measures of employment are job growth and the unemployment rate. Along with the nation and the world, the job market in Florida experienced an unprecedented contraction in the second quarter of 2020 when a large part of the Florida economy either shut down or sent workers home to slow the spread of the Coronavirus. Employment dropped by over 1.2 million jobs from February 2020 to April 2020, a loss of 14.0 percent of the jobs pre-pandemic. By June 2020, 42.0 percent of those lost jobs returned. Protected by federal stimulus programs and improved consumer demand for services, another 28.0 percent of the lost jobs returned by June 2021, yet Florida still had 374,000 fewer jobs more than a year after the start of the pandemic.

After a -1.1 decline in FY 2019-20, the Conference expects total non-farm employment to decline by -3.1 percent in FY 2020-21 and rebound by +5.7 percent in FY 2021-22 to finally regain its FY 2018-19 peak. Thereafter, annual growth moderates to slightly above 1 percent. Given the

unique circumstances wrought by the pandemic, jobs in leisure and hospitality are not expected to reach pre-COVID-19 levels until FY 2023-24.

Florida's unemployment rate dropped to 3.2 percent in September through December 2019, which became the second lowest recorded unemployment rates in a business cycle since the series began in 1976. With the onset of the Coronavirus outbreak, the unemployment rate spiked to 14.2 percent in May 2020, handily surpassing the prior peak rate of 10.9 percent experienced in January to April 2010 during the Great Recession. Given the short period over which the change from ultra low to ultra high occurred, it was stunning. By December, the state's unemployment rate had dropped back to 5.1 percent, and by March 2021 to 4.7 percent. The Conference believes that the unemployment rate peaked in the last quarter of the state's 2019-20 fiscal year and expects it to average 4.4 percent in FY 2021-22. Thereafter, the rate continues its slow downward drift until it reaches 3.5 percent in FY 2023-24 and then plateaus around 4.0 percent. The Economic Estimating Conference assumes the "full employment" unemployment rate is about this level.



Two areas of the state's economy indirectly benefited from the pandemic, but with a future payback: real estate and construction. Throughout the worst of the crisis, these economic sectors thrived. In the first quarter of calendar 2021, single-family starts were +24.0 percent higher than the same period last year, while multi-family starts were -20.5 percent lower. Total private housing starts reached a 15-year high of over 187,000 units on an annualized basis in the same period, yet they are far from the housing boom high of almost 295,000 annualized units in the third quarter of 2005. Total starts are projected to grow by 10.0 percent in FY 2020-21 but decline for the next 10 years as residential construction activity slows. At the end of the ten-year forecast period, total private housing starts are still well below the peak FY 2004-05 level of 272,252 units. Weighed down by the protracted recovery in the housing market after the collapse of the housing boom in the 2006-07 and 2007-08 fiscal years, total construction expenditures finally surpassed its prior peak from FY 2005-06 in FY 2019-20. Propped by residential housing and, to a lesser extent, expedited public construction projects, the category is expected to increase 4.7 percent in FY 2020-21, covering for the losses in private non-residential construction expenditures caused by the pandemic-induced economic contraction. Total expenditures grow at 4.1 percent in FY 2021-22, but then revert to generally +3.0 percent growth for the remainder of the forecast. Continuing cost

pressures lead total construction expenditures higher in each subsequent year. Reflecting the overall constraints in the construction industry, construction employment does not get back to its peak level from FY 2005-06 in the ten-year forecast window.

New light vehicle registrations were a source of strength in the Florida economic forecast as the state recovered from the Great Recession, but contracted by -6.3 percent in FY 2019-20. New light truck registrations and, even more so, new automobile registrations faltered in the second part of FY 2019-20 as Florida consumers worried about their futures and stay at home orders were put in place. With record low interest rates and inflated savings providing significant incentives, total sales for the first quarter of 2021 were up 17.0 percent over the same period last year, mainly due to light truck sales and the boost from two more rounds of stimulus payments. The overall increase in FY 2020-21 was 8.5 percent. Reflecting a likely pull forward from what would have been sales in later periods, new light vehicle sales will decline by 4.0 percent in FY 2021-22. The Conference projects only subdued gains alternating with slight declines for the rest of the period.

Finally, Florida's tourism-sensitive economy is particularly vulnerable to the longer-term effects of the pandemic. Previous economic studies of disease outbreaks have shown that it can take as much as twelve to fifteen months *after* the outbreak ends for tourism to return to pre-disease levels. The magnitude of this event is greater, and the timing is less clear due to the surging Delta variant of Covid-19. The total number of tourists declined -69 percent from the prior year in the second quarter of 2020. After that dramatic drop, tourism managed to recover to 68.0 percent of the last full pre-COVID quarter by the first quarter of 2021, buttressed by the increased number of domestic visitors travelling to Florida by car. Several industry groups have already predicted that it will take at least two years to reach recovery from this pandemic. Current expectations are that leisure driving vacations will recover first, and then—in order—business travel, domestic air travel, and international travel. The timing will be influenced by the actual course of the disease over the next few months, as well as the widespread distribution of vaccines globally. Even so, the Conference expects robust growth during Fiscal Year 2021-22, with a projected overall increase of 38.4 percent from the extremely suppressed level in Fiscal Year 2020-21. The growth rate moderates thereafter. While the new forecast levels never exceed the pre-pandemic forecast levels, they come close in the latter part of the 10-year forecast horizon.
