Attached for your information is the post-session outlook for the State Employees' Health Insurance Trust Fund, including all changes made by the Legislature.

Florida Consensus Estimating Conference State Employees' Health Insurance Executive Summary

The attached tables contain the outlook for the State Employees' Health Insurance Trust Fund for 1990-91, 1991-92, and 1992-93. The projections reflect the changes made during the 1991 Legislative session, outlined below.

Premiums

State premiums increase effective 7/1/91, employee premiums effective 1/1/92.

Prescription Drug Program

Effective 7/1/91, the copayment for brand name drugs will increase to \$11.00 for both card and mail order purchases, while the copayment for generic drugs will increase to \$5.00 for both card and mail order purchases.

Physician office visits

Effective 1/1/92, calendar year deductibles will be replaced by a \$10 per visit fee for preferred provider care (PPC) and a \$20 per visit fee for non-PPC care for all defined physician and physician-related services and office visits, not including well baby care. Copayments are applied after the per visit deductible.

Per admission hospital fees

Per admission fees for hospital in-patient care are increased, effective 7/1/91, from \$50 to \$100 for PPC providers, and from \$200 to \$250 for non-PPC providers, with no calendar year deductible.

Physical Examinations

A \$100 per calendar year physical examination benefit is provided for each employee covered under the State Group Health Self-Insurance Plan. Mobile health examinations will no longer be provided.

Maximum out-of-pocket expenses

Effective 1/1/92, maximum annual out-of-pocket expenses are increased from \$1500 to \$2500.
